Faculty Thoughts: Cathy Cox



I recently found out that my mom has never voted. According to some surveys, almost half of all United States citizens who are eligible to vote do not cast a ballot. The field of *electoral psychology* is interested in studying factors that influence people's choices and whether or not they vote. Voter apathy has been found to be associated with political disengagement, government mistrust, a diffusion of responsibility (i.e., the misperception that other people are more qualified), and evaluation apprehension (i.e., being judged negatively for one's actions). At the same time, however, individuals are more likely to vote if they feel

social shame, altruistic, have community gratitude, or close social ties. This year, which also coincides with 100th anniversary of women's constitutional right to vote, my mom will be casting her ballot for the very first time.
